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MISHTUK CORPORATION UPDATE

- Waswanipi Category 1 Land Road Project
- Deforestation of road rights-of-way
- Change of culverts and forest drainage
- Maintenance & rehabilitation of the rolling surface



CREE LUMBER UPDATE

Cree Lumber is a fully operational sawmill with a workforce of 99% of Cree employees. In January, Cree Lumber faced a substantial setback due to a fire incident, which has initiated an investigation. Plans are underway for a rebuild with Chantier.



ASINII CORPORATION UPDATE

Formerly known as Miyuukaa Corporation, the organization is currently undergoing a rebranding process. Their main role is upholding communication channels with Windfall. NIMISCHUU CORPORATION UPDATE

The Nimischoo Corporation, responsible for the operation of the transmission line, announces its official launch. The corporation commenced its operations on May 31st, 2024, and the transmission line is approaching completion. Windfall has been utilizing the electricity provided by the transmission line.
